### **Course completion conditions:**

Students present a chosen topic related to citizenship and cultures in EU, and must write a seminar paper on a chosen topic using citation apparatus according to the faculty directive on final works. Part of the assessment is also a final written exam.

Students are assessed on the basic concepts of the curriculum by giving a presentation, writing a seminar paper and by taking a written exam.

By the end of the course, students should be able to objectively assess the studied phenomena including issues of citizenship and cultures in the EU and to form a critical opinion about them. Students have the right to resit the written exam once. The final written exam consists of topics that can be found in the 'Main course topics' section below.

This includes information about national cultural diversity in the context of the EU. The final assessment corresponds to the A-FX grading scale: A (100 - 94%), B (93 - 87%), C (86 - 80%), D (79 - 73%), E (72 - 65%).

Credits are assigned to students who acquire a minimum of 65%.

### a) continuous assessment:

Writing of a seminar paper (10 pages) and presentation on a chosen topic (10 minutes) together: 40%.

#### b) final assessment:

Final written exam -60%.

#### **Learning objectives:**

By the end of this course students should be able to:

- analyse professional texts.
- synthesize their knowledge and apply it to their seminar paper.
- compare the chosen concepts of citizenship.
- acquire the main ideas of European active citizenship.
